

## *Senior Meals*

Senior Meals offers a nutritious, well-balanced, noontime meal Monday through Friday, plus a chance to meet and spend time with others. We can provide transportation to the dining center when requested. Home delivered meals are available to those who are ill or disabled.

All persons 60 years of age and older and their spouses may participate. There are no income requirements to participate. Individuals under 60 years of age are welcome with a required \$5.00 per meal fee.

## *Donations*

There is no mandatory fee for the senior meal program. We suggest a \$2.50 donation each meal to help defray expenses. Many who participate are unable to make any donations; some contribute much more. Transportation is available in most areas of the county with a suggested donation of one dollar per round trip.

Meals are served Monday through Friday (except for Agency holidays) at dining centers located throughout Butte County. Special programs and entertainment are often scheduled before meals. Call for reservations and serving times.

A main dish, vegetable or salad, fruit or dessert, and beverages are served. Each month the menu plan is reviewed by a certified nutritionist to assure that we serve a nutritious and well-balanced meal.

## *Food Bank*

The Agency operates a Regional Food Bank in a five county area, including Butte, Glenn, Colusa, Plumas and Sierra Counties. Surplus foods are distributed to qualified individuals and families once a month in various locations through the counties.

Individuals and families whose income is within 150% of the poverty guidelines are eligible to participate. Participants self-certify eligibility on the day the surplus food is distributed by showing proof of income and address.

The Agency operates a regional Food Bank as a part of America's Second Harvest the Nation's Food Bank network. Surplus food is donated by providers and distributed throughout the country via a network of affiliated food banks.

The Agency operates its Food Bank from its Oroville warehouse through a network of volunteers and nonprofits committed to easing hunger and increasing food security of low-income households. New initiatives including Farm to Family are intended to bring fresh produce to households to improve nutrition and health as well as to combat obesity.
